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The Use Of Modern Technologies In The Educational Process

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"interpreter" (통역사), "translator" (번역가), "writer" (작가), or "poet" (시인), professionals from these fields can be invited to class for discussions;

- "Council of Thinkers" (사상가 회의) Inviting literary figures like W. Shakespeare, A. Navoi, and R. Burns into the lesson through their wise sayings can help students grow into well-rounded individuals;
- "When pictures speak" (사진이 말을 할 때) A convenient method to develop students' oral language skills using topic-related images;
- "Quiz cards" (퀴즈 카드) Distributing cards according to the number of students ensures everyone participates at the same time and saves time.

As we have seen, each innovative technology has its unique advantages. All these methods aim at cooperation between teacher and student, as well as active student participation in the learning process.
